CAMP RULES

- 1 No fireworks or pyrotechnics of any kind allowed in the camp or the surrounding ranch at any time. No firearms, except for authorized law enforcement officers or those authorized by the missionaries.
- 2 No hunting in the camp.
- 3 At all times, maintain a sufficient number of vehicles prepared to evacuate all campers and visitors in case of emergency.
- 4 When unloading, remain on roadways, unload supplies and equipment then move to parking area. Park pointing outward, towards the road.
- 5 Keep all motor vehicles only on designated roadways (fire prevention and vegetation protection); No ATVs, UTVs (side-by-sides), motorcycles, motor bikes or other motorized toys or equipment in the campground except for campground host's and missionary's.
- 6 Drive safely, watch for pedestrians and please keep speeds down to 15 miles per hour or less in the camp.

Emergencies

- 7 If an emergency occurs, **dial 911** to report the emergency at **The Old Pinery Campground**. The local authorities are familiar with it's location, Then notify the on-site missionaries.
- 8 For major emergencies, (fire, bear sighting, etc.) **dial 911**, assemble every person in a designated area, account for everyone and prepare to evacuate. Notify the Camp Missionaries.

Camping

- 9 All LDS youth groups should be accompanied by, at least, 2 adult priesthood holders (preferably Melchizedek), and in girls camps, adult women leaders need to be present.
- 10 Camp in designated camp spaces, only. A separate area for camp trailers is planned. Until then, see the camp missionaries as to where to place equipment and camp trailers. No hook-ups available.
- 11 No open flames (candles, fireworks, matches, etc.) except in provided fire rings. Do not make improvised fire rings except for training, then extinguish and scatter them. Keep a full water bucket near at all times
- 12 Do not hang open flame devices, propane lanterns or other heat generating equipment on or around any wooden feature or structure. See pictures below.



- 13 Designate someone to monitor fires and ensure the fires are extinguished prior to leaving the area or retiring for the evening. Keep a full bucket of water and a shovel nearby. Buckets and shovels provided.

- 14 Noise restrictions will be strictly enforced between 10:00 PM and 7:00 AM including generators, radios, mobile devices, voices, laughter, giggles and screams (unless attacked by bears), etc.
- 15 Do not purposefully interact with wild life. Deer, turkeys and squirrels reside throughout the camp. Do not feed the animals; some carry disease and some bite.
- 16 Report any (rare) bear sightings immediately. **Walk quietly**, do not run, to the lodge or nearest leader.
- 17 Keep all foods including snacks in locked and sealed containers until ready to be consumed. **DO NOT keep any foods, snacks or drinks (except water) in tents or in sleeping areas.**
- 18 Place all trash, especially food, in the trash barrels and insure that every barrel is emptied into the camp trash receptacle every evening. See the missionaries for trash bags.
- 19 Report any equipment malfunctions or needs; clogged toilets, toilet paper, etc. Provide sacks for sanitary napkins. Do not flush sanitary napkins or anything bulky down the toilets.
- 20 Please practice water conservation. When the showers are open, please limit showers to 2 (two) minutes. Wash hair outside of the showers. The septic system does not tolerate hair well.
- 21 All facilities must be inspected by the camp host or missionaries prior to campers leaving. Campers will be responsible to see that all facilities are left in clean and working order and trash is picked up.
- 22 Any camp owned equipment, buildings facilities, etc. damaged or lost will be paid for by the renting unit.
- 23 Please schedule some time for a service project of 4 hours per group, per week. See the on-site missionaries for a project.
- 24 We have Eagle and youth projects for anyone interested.
