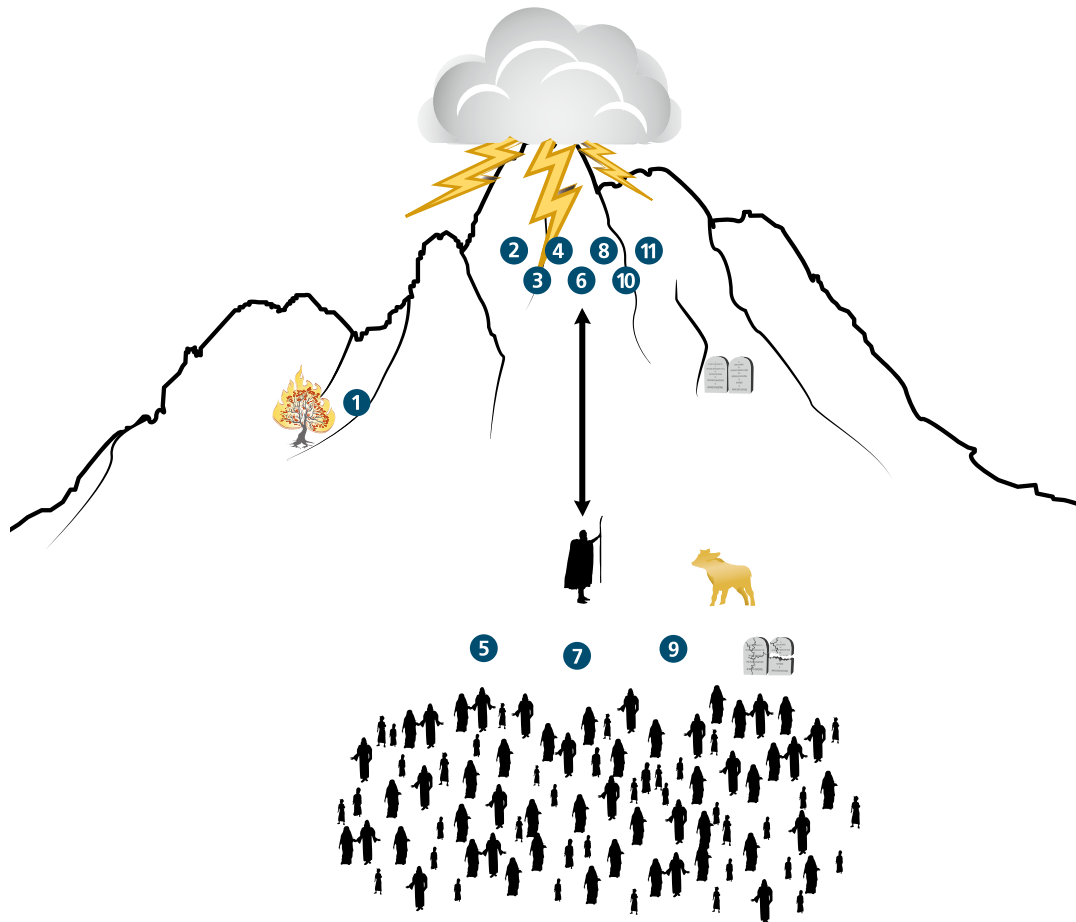


Moses's and Israel's Experiences with Jehovah at Mount Sinai (Exodus 19–34)
