

# “‘E Hoko Mai ‘a e Ngaahi Tāpuakí Hili ‘a e Ngaahi Faingata‘a Lahi” (TF 58:4)

Na‘e tūuta ‘a e Kolo Kolesivilí, kau ai ‘a Poli Naiti mo hono foha ko Niuelí, ki he Vahefonua Siakisoni, Mīsuli, ‘oku kei taimi fe‘unga pē ke nau kau ‘i hono fakatapui e kelekele ‘o Saioné ki hono tānaki fakataha e Kāingalotú. Na‘e manatu‘i ‘e Niueli Naiti:

“I he ‘aho hono ua ‘o ‘Akosí, na‘e tokoni ai ‘a Misa Siosefa Sāmita ko e Si‘i, ko e Palōfita ‘a e ‘Otuá, ki he Kolo Kolesivilí, ki hono fokotu‘o e fuofua kupu‘i ‘akau ko ha fakava‘e ki . . . Saione ‘i he Kolo ko Koá, na‘e maile ‘e hongofulu mā ua ki he fakahihifo ‘o Tau‘atāiná. Na‘e fata ‘e ha kau tangata ‘e toko hongofulu mā ua ‘a e kupu‘i ‘akaú, ko ha faka‘apa‘apa ki he fa‘ahinga ‘e hongofulu mā ua ‘o ‘Isilelí. I he taimi tatau, na‘e tāpuakí‘i fakatapui e kelekele ‘o Saioné ‘e ‘Eletā Sitenei Likitoni ‘i ha lotu, ki hono tānaki fakataha ‘o e Kāingalotú Ko ha fa‘ahita‘u mo‘oni ‘eni ‘o e fiefiá ki he Kāingalotu kotoa pē [ne nau] mātā iá. . . .

“I he ‘aho hono tolu ‘o Akosí, na‘e fakatapui ai ‘e feitu‘u tu‘u‘anga o e tempipalé, na‘e tu‘u ‘i he fakahihifo ‘o . . . Tau‘atāiná” (Newel Knight autobiography and journal, circa 1846–1847, Church History Library, Salt Lake City; na‘e fakatonutonu ‘a e sipelá, mata‘itohi lahí, mo e faka‘ilonga leá).

Na‘e kehe e ngaahi fakafeangai ‘a e kaumātu‘a ne ‘i he fakatapu‘i ki he me‘a ne hokó:

“Ne ‘i ai ha ni‘hi ‘o e kaumātu‘á, hangē ko Leinolo Kahuní, ne nau vakai ki ha ngaahi faingamālie fakafo‘e lava ke hoko tupu mei he ngaahi kamata‘anga fakafofonga ko ‘ení. Na‘á ne tohi ‘o pehē, ‘Na‘e mamata ai hoku mata fakamateli‘i ki ha ngaahi me‘a māongo‘onga mo fakafo‘e, ‘a ia ne te‘eki ke u mamata ai ‘i he māmani ko ‘ení.’ Ka na‘e ‘ikai ofo ‘a ‘Eselā Puuti ia ‘i he kii‘i kamata‘anga ko iá. Na‘á ne pehē ko ha ‘me‘a ke fie‘ilo ki ai, ka na‘e ‘ikai fe‘unga ke fai ai ha fononga ki Mīsuli ke sio ai’” (Matthew McBride, “Ezra Booth and Isaac Morley,” ‘i he *Revelations in Context*, ed. I he ‘aho 7 ‘o ‘Akosí, hili ia ha ‘aho ‘e fā mei hono fakatapui e tu‘u‘anga ‘o e tempipalé, na‘e pekia ai ‘a Poli Naiti. Na‘e fakamatala‘i ‘e hono foha ko Niuelí ‘a e ngaahi tūkunga ‘o ‘ene mālōlo‘o ‘o pehē:

“Na‘á ne kuikui fakalongolongo pē ‘o mohe, ‘o pekia mo e fiefia ‘i he fuakava fo‘ou mo ta‘engatá ‘o e ongoongo-leleí, mo fakalangilangi‘i e ‘Otuá he kuó ne mó‘ui ke mamata ki he fonua ko Saioné pea mo mālōlō hono sinó ‘i he melino, hili ‘ene faingata‘a‘ia ‘o hangē ko ia kuó ne a‘usia mei he fakatanga ‘o e kau angahalá” (Newel Knight autobiography and journal, circa 1846–1847, Church History Library, Salt Lake City; na‘e fakatonutonu ‘a e sipelá, mata‘itohi lahí, mo e faka‘ilonga leá).

- ‘Okú ke pehē ko e hā na‘e mātūaki kehe ai e ngaahi ongo ‘a Poli Naiti fekau‘aki mo hono fakatapui e kelekele ‘o Saioné mei he ngaahi ongo ‘a ‘Eselā Pūti?
- Ko e hā e ngaahi tāpuaki na‘e ma‘u ‘e Poli Naiti koe‘uhí ko ‘ene kei faivelenga ai pē lolotonga e faingata‘a? (Vakai, TF 59:1–2, ‘a ia na‘e fakahā ‘e he ‘Eikí ‘i he ‘aho ‘o e me‘a faka‘eiki ‘o Polí.)
- Ko e hā ha ngaahi a‘usia kuo tokoni atu ke ke ‘ilo ‘e tāpuekina ‘e he ‘Eikí ‘a kinautolu ‘oku nau kei faivelenga ‘i he lotolotonga ‘o e faingata‘a?
